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Call Me Ishi – Husband

"And it shall be at that day, saith the LORD, that thou shalt call me Ishi [Husband]; and shalt call me no more Baali [Master]. For I will take away the names of Baalim [Master] out of her mouth, and they shall no more be remembered by their name.

And in that day will I make a covenant for them with the beasts of the field, and with the fowls of heaven, and with the creeping things of the ground: and I will break the bow and the sword and the battle out of the earth, and will make them to lie down safely. Genesis 2 – Ish – Isha – Ishi

Etymology of the name Ishi - I

"The name **Ishi** is identical to the phrase 'my husband' (literally 'my man') as used in Genesis 2:18, 21-23 29:32-34, 2 Samuel 14:5 and 2 Kings 4:1 and that is because the word ') איש (ish) is one of a few words for man.

In the Bible, societies are feminine (and maternal) and although some scholars insist on a whole other but identical root, the noun ') אשה (sha) means woman or wife. And again perhaps from a whole other root or perhaps the same one, the noun ') שואיש (sha) means man, or rather man of; man in some specific function such as "man of war" or "man of the earth." It is also the common word for husband.

Since societies form around central fires (or the "purifying light" of wisdom, which is where the metaphor comes from), the noun ') איש (הוב השלה), fire, may also derive from this verb. There is only a small difference between the words (ba'ali) and בעלי (ba'ali) as both are used to mean my husband. But (ba'ali) is more an authoritative title; it may also mean my master or my lord. The word (ishi) simply means my man, which may denote one's equal husband or a man one has employed.

Etymology of the name Ishi - II

This name comes from the verb) ישעע**yasha**'), meaning to save or deliver.

This version of the name Ishi occurs four times in the Bible, twice in Judah (1 Chronicles 2:31 and 4:20), once in Simeon as the father of the men who destroyed the Amalekites (1 Chronicles 4:42) and one in Manasseh (1 Chronicles 5:24)." https://www.abarim-publications.com/Meaning/Ishi.html#.X8U9H2hKhPY



They Shall be One Flesh

"The Eden home of our first parents was prepared for them by God Himself. Genocide of the Human Race – Abortion – Euthanasia – Homosexuality

"Satan's enmity against God's law had impelled him to war against every precept of the Decalogue. But should one be burned in passing through the fire, his fate was sealed; it was believed that the anger of the gods could be appeased only by taking the life of the victim, and he was accordingly offered as a sacrifice. In times of great apostasy these abominations prevailed, to some extent, among the Israelites. [It was practiced by king Solomon.] [Practiced today with Abortion.

The violation of the seventh commandment also was early practiced in the name of religion. The most licentious and abominable rites were made a part of the heathen worship. The gods themselves were represented as impure, and their worshipers gave the rein to the baser passions. Unnatural vices prevailed and the religious festivals were characterized by universal and open impurity." [Baal Peor worship involved homosexuality, lesbianism and was considered the vilest type of worship – and again in times of great apostasy these abominations prevailed, to some extent, among the Israelites.] [And it prevails to with same sex marriage – LGBT.] Patriarchs and Prophets, 337.
