**12.** Number '7' and Divine Perfection

"And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made." Genesis 2:2

◆ The first use of the number '7' in the Bible relates to the creation week of 7 days in Genesis 1 and 2.

• The 7th day was to be "set apart" for Israel, the Sabbath was a holy day of rest. Exodus 20:8 -11

◆ At the beginning of the Bible, the number 7 is identified with something being "finished" or complete?.

♦ 7 is often found in contexts involving completeness or divine perfection.

There are more than 500 instances of the number '7' in the Bible. The book of Revelation contains more than 50 instances.

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**13.** The Plan of Redemption and the End of the Conflict


**13.** The Plan of Redemption and the End of the Conflict

....From the first the great controversy had been upon the law of God. Satan had sought to prove that God was unjust, that His law was faulty, and that the good of the universe required it to be changed. In the controversy it was to be shown whether the divine statutes were defective and subject to change, or perfect and immutable.
