

An Ecological Calendar – Connected with Laudato-Si – 2016 – 2020

I have been doing some research to see if there is anything new with regards to calendar reform talk. I have known that there has been a generally growing talk of how "climate change" has been impacting the seasons with agricultural calendars around the world. I have been watching this to see if it is gaining traction in a significant way on more serious global levels, especially as it pertains to religious discussions, etc .

I have included a link that was an article done in 2016 by the National Catholic Reporter blog column titled, "Please, leave easter on nature's time". In the article Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby is quoted saying, "Easter is about living in nature's time". He is very much encouraging a fixed easter unity.

While some of this maybe things we have been hearing talked about before, there is new more vitalized discussions about this from this angle in a more public way we have not seen before. It is very impacting is when you put it all together, making for a pattern that clearly demonstrates movements that have been underground and are surfacing more and more out in the open.
